

Santa Fe Trail Balloon Rally


JULY 4TH WEEKEND

The Gate City Music Festival attracts top talent to play in our historic Shuler Theater. Throw in some street dancing, great food and a beer tent and we've got a party going on!




Run to Raton EVERY JULY




Raton is all about Parks and Recreation!

Raton offers several parks for playing, picnicking, and enjoying the outdoors. Activities range from playground fun to walking paths, hiking paths, basketball, baseball, football, indoor swimming, disc golf (2 courses), and more!

Ripley Park is a local favorite, located in downtown Raton, featuring a playground, picnic tables and a gazebo. Its the perfect spot to enjoy the beautiful scenery of our town, and why not take a stroll down our historic first street?









Golfing

The Raton Golf Course is a challenging 9-hole course that can be played as 18 holes due to 2 tee boxes.

Nestled at the base of the Rocky Mountains, players can enjoy beautiful vistas of the mountains and mesas with deer, wild turkey, and the occasional fox, bear, or mountain lion.

The Raton Country Club, located above the Golf Pro Shop, features a variety if events and dinners and is used as a venue for special events. The course is open to the public and features an 18hole disc golf course as well.

Hiking

Sugarite Canyon is chock-full of hiking trails! Eleven to be exact! Even close to town, you'll feel like you are miles into the wilderness in the beautiful scenery and wild life! Trails range from moderate to very diffcult so check our local Ramblin' Round Raton hiking guide for trail maps and info.

If you'd rather stay closer to town Climax Canyon is perfect for you. The Climax Canyon trailhead is right off of downtown and offers easy and challenging hiking trails. The hike is very worth the vistas and view of our beautiful town.

Fishing

Raton's location makes it a prime location for fishing enthusiasts with many gorgeous and productive streams and lakes in our region.

Within a quick 15 minute drive from downtown Raton you can get to the two lakes in Sugarite Canyon State Park and a third in Colorado, Lake Dorothy. Keep a watchful eye on your drive up as there are always some turkey, deer or maybe a bear crossing the road!

Lake Malloya is a great spot for the family, with picnic areas, docks, and ADA fishing access. This is a great spot for experienced anglers and the grandkids.

Kayaking & SUP

Lake Malloya, In Sugarite Canyon is a superb place for kayaking and stand up paddleboarding. Lake Malloya is a nowake lake and has some great coves for beginners to learn and is large enough for the more experienced to get a real workout.



Aquatic Center

The Raton Regional Aquatic Center is a state of the art aquatic facility located in the heart of Roundhouse Memorial Park in downtown Raton. With a variety of features there is something for everyone.

The Raton Regional Aquatic Center features:

Shuler Theater

The historic Shuler Theater in downtown Raton, is a state landmark and remains the center for performing arts in northeastern New Mexico.

Very much worth a tour, the Shuler has preserved many of its original features including three of the original drop curtains. One depicts a Roman palace framed by elaborate draperies and another is the original fire curtain, depicting a scene from the Palisades of Cimarron against a background of American Indian motifs. The Shuler lobby is the permanent home to eight WPA murals dating to 1934 by artist Manville Chapman.

Raton Museum


Founded in 1939, the museum is located in Historic Downtown Raton at 108 S. 2nd Street. This museum has extensive exhibits of the history of Raton, including the coal mines, railroad and ranching. The museum also hosts many special events throughout the year.

This museum receives high marks from tourists for the quality of the curation and the wonderful tales spun by the Museum Director. The Raton Museum is truly a small town gem that is worth a stop.

Old Pass Gallery

The Old Pass Gallery is located in the heart of Raton's historic district on 1st Street. The gallery is housed in an old Wells Fargo station and next to our historic train station, with Amtrak service. The gallery has regular shows of local and regional artists and a gift shop with locally made goods and books by local authors.

No trip to Raton is complete without a trip to historic 1st Street and a stop in the Old Pass Gallery is a must.



Maxwell, NM

Maxwell is located between Raton and Springer in Northeastern NM. Maxwell was established in 1879 as a railroad town and was named in honor of Lucien Maxwell, who provided the land for the orininal town site from his Maxwell I and Grant.

Maxwell has several lakes, two of which allow fishing. Lake 13 is on the wildlife refuge and is also available for primitive camping and Stubblefield Lake 10 miles west of Maxwell offers only fishing.

Springer, NM

Springer once served as the Colfax County Seat from 1882 to 1897. Historic buildings worth exploring in Springer include the former County Courthouse which now houses the Santa Fe Trail Museum. Right down the street you'll find the Livery Stables, a building built of quarried stone in 1880 closed for several years, but is now open for scheduled tours.

Springer is also home to the Colfax County Fair Grounds and the weeklong fair in August.

Trinidad, CO

Sister city to Raton, Trinidad shares much of the fascinating history of our region. Several history museums, an artcar museum and a picturesque downtown, make Trinidad a fun stop for the family.

Raton and Trinidad will soon be a big jumping off point for hikers, mountain bikers and horse riders with the opening of Colorado's newest state park, Fishers Peak Ranch State Park. The park will be accessible from CO and NM and stands to be one of the largest outdoor recreation spots in all of CO and NM.

Cimarron, NM

Cimarron—where the Rockies meet the plains. Untamed and wild, a long history of outlaws, western heroes and historical events give the town a unique and deep history.

For history buffs, Cimarron is a great place to dive into colorful western lore. For wilderness adventurers, Cimarron is the launch point for a dive into spectacular wilderness including such areas as the Valle Vidal.

Eagle Nest, NM

Part of the Enchanted Circle in Northeastern NM, Eagle Nest shares in the history of gunslingers, ghost towns and gold mining.

Eagle Nest Lake is 103 years old this year and is part of Eagle Nest State Park. This lake is often one of the hot spots for the best fishing in all of NM, growing some big trout and, if you're up for the challenge, some monster pike.

Eagle Nest is a good base camp to fish, hike and enjoy the beautiful Moreno Valley. Come and enjoy the lodges, restaurants, gift and specialty stores as well as musical events and local flavor.

Angel Fire, NM

Angel Fire is a beautiful mountain town with a year-round population of about 1,200. In both winter and summer, Angel Fire draws tens of thousands of people to enjoy the clean mountain air and pristine views.

Angel Fire boasts a top notch ski resort, golf course, mountain bike circuit, year round events, art fairs, along with an excellent farmers market to give vistors many things to see and do!

Red River, NM

Red River is nestled in the Sangre de Cristo Mountains at the top of the Enchanted Circle. Though this tiny town has less than 500 permanent residents, it attracts tens of thousands of tourists to premier events such as the Memorial Day Bike Rally.

This little village hosts a fabulous ski resort and lots of summer attractions making it a year-round destination. Red River is well known for music events and new establishments, such as Red River Brewing Company. Red River offers what today's travelers want while honoring the town's rich past.
